

# IMPORTANT NOTE FOR OUR SURGICAL PATIENTS

(Prior to your surgery): This *surgical reference sheet* NEEDS TO BE PLACED in an area where it can conveniently be referred to by you, after your surgery. A night-stand or refrigerator are common places many patients choose. After your surgery has occurred, it is common to have a variety of questions. This surgical reference sheet will be your guide and help answer these common questions:

## What to Expect After Surgery

- Some swelling.
- Some Bruising.
- Some tenderness.
- Normal to develop hard knots around incision. May apply warm, moist heat 3-4 times per day to help with tenderness and reduce knot.

## **Surgical Site Care Instructions**

- You may shower once you are discharged from the hospital.

#### **Pain Mgmt After Surgery**

- You will be given an appropriate prescription for pain medicine. Take as directed by your physician.
- After that prescription, a patient's remaining pain is generally managed with over-the-counter pain medications. Pain medication such as ibuprofen (Advil<sup>™</sup> or Motrin<sup>™</sup>) <u>OR</u> acetominafin (Tylenol<sup>™</sup>) <u>OR</u> naproxen (Aleve<sup>™</sup>) can be taken. Follow label instructions.

## **Other Helpful Information**

- May drive once you are <u>no longer using prescription</u> pain medicine.
- Encouraged to be out of bed to eat meals and use the restroom. Daily walking is encouraged. Then gradually increase with activities as tolerated.
- Good to elevate your leg for the first couple of days after surgery.
- Avoid hot tubs, hot baths or hot showers for 7 days following surgery.

### When to Contact Our Office

- Fever of 101° or greater.
- Increased redness or swelling around incision.
- Have a sudden or large amount of drainage from incision.
- Have a sudden increase in pain.
